## Circuit and dive sites



*Over the course of 10 nights, we will traverse a little over 400 nautical miles visiting the crystal blue waters surrounding no fewer than 4 of the major islands of the Bahamas.*

### NEW PROVIDENCE

The crystal-clear blue waters surrounding New Providence Island offer an **extensive range of diving opportunities**. You can explore everything from shallow natural reefs to deeper walls, drop-offs, blue holes, and numerous wrecks lying at depths between 15m (50ft) and 30m (100ft). Many of these wrecks have been intentionally sunk to create artificial reefs.

Most of the premier dive sites are found around the western end of New Providence Island. This area also features spectacular wall dives along the drop-off into the Tongue of the Ocean, which separates New Providence from Andros Island. With such a diverse selection of dive sites, guests can choose where to dive while we remain anchored off New Providence.

An abundance of wrecks, most intentionally sunk, offer a plethora of artificial reefs full of life from macro life such as nudibranch to some of the largest Caribbean reef sharks you will ever see.

### ANDROS

Andros, the largest island in the Bahamas, is home to the **world's third-largest fringing barrier reef** and the highest concentration of blue holes. These blue holes can be described as openings to a complex cave system formed during the ice age, extending beneath oceanic blue beneath both the island and the sea floor. The oceanic blue holes are linked to inland ones, resulting in a mix of fresh and saltwater that is influenced by tidal changes. **The stunning geological features and distinctive marine life make diving in these blue holes a truly exceptional experience.**

## Safety first

All aquatic activities are under the supervision of a qualified instructor (CMAS or PADI) of the Seafari team.

Before each activity Instructors on board will make a detailed presentation of the site, currents, wildlife and safety rules to be observed.

The choice of sites is at the discretion of the captain and Seafari Senior Instructor depending on the season and weather conditions.

The senior instructor may impose in water supervision or restriction from diving to any diver whose technical level is not sufficient to guaranty safe diving conditions.
